# Description

- Stemmed drinking glass
- Colorless blown and wheel-engraved glass
- Eastern France
- Circa 1750
- Perfect condition of conservation
- Height: 15.4 cm; diameter of the bowl: 6.9 cm; diameter of the foot: 7.4 cm
- Blown and molded glass on foot. The cut is decorated on its edge with a wheel-cut frieze while the slightly conical leg has sides with an interior bubble. The foot has a hemmed edge.
- Blown glass in three gobs, conical cut, molded polylobed leg and hemmed flat foot. Two glasses are represented in Jacqueline Bellanger's "use and prestige glass...", one p.477 of the same type
