Giuseppe Guastalla (Florence, 1867 - Rome, 1952), who moved with his family to Rome after the Breach of Porta Pia, showed a marked inclination towards drawing and sculpture from an early age. He began an apprenticeship in the studio of Ettore Ferrari (1845-1929), learning from him that dry and decisive monumentalism, a vehicle for ideological and political content. Towards the 1990s, subjects of a celebratory nature, often linked to the commission to create public monuments, were joined by episodes taken from everyday and popular reality, as well as genre sculptures, characterised by a profound expressive modernity.
