Joseph Gabriel AGARD (received master in 1725 - died in 1750) Pot spoon Solid silver Paris, 1746 - 1747 Weight: 193 g Length: 36.5 cm Provenance: A castle in Loir-et-Cher Joseph Gabriel AGARD, goldsmith jeweler collector Apprentice goldsmith from June 4, 1715 with Jean Baptiste Boucher, by contract before Baudin, notary. He is 15 years old. Received Master on February 7, 1725, he lives rue de Harlay, parish of St. Barthélemy. Master in Paris, guaranteed by Jean-B. Butcher, master of the same street and parish, he had his hallmark inscribed: Crowned fleur-de-lys, two grains, JAG, a fly. Died on March 4, 1750, a sealed inventory was carried out. On March 14, 1750 the seals were lifted and a sale was prepared and was announced from April 27, 1750. The posters in
