Bronze with green patina. Eastern Roman art / Levant 2nd-3rd century. Diameter: 13cm height with ring: 19 cm

These bronze lion head handles were produced in a set of four pieces to be attached to wooden sarcophagi a typical production of the Eastern Mediterranean, many parallels can be found in Thomas Weber's book Syrisch-römische Sarkophagbeschläge.

The handle is decorated with a lion's head with a radiant mane with incised details, large almond-shaped eyes with dilated pupils, the fluted ring is inserted in the open mouth. Three
