apprenticeship with a knife manufacturer. In 1820 he established a company manufacturing surgical instruments which had around 400 employees around 1840. He became the personal supplier of Guillaume Dupuytren1. Charrière obtained French nationality in 1843. He was married to Madeleine Elisa Berrurier, daughter of a Parisian butcher. Among his disciples we find Georges-Guillaume-Amatus Lüer, Louis-Joseph Mathieu and Adolphe Collin in Paris, Josef Leiter in Vienna and Camillus Nyrop in Copenhagen. In 1851 Charrière was promoted to Officer of the Legion of Honor.
