Our medallion armchairs are a perfect illustration of the distinction between furnishing and flying furniture. Furnishing furniture, with its flat back, is designed to stay in place. Our seats, with their cabriolet backs, are part of the flying furniture category, which can be moved to suit your mood for playing, having tea or sitting in the lounge. Our armchairs are a synthesis of an iconic model whose shape is still being reworked by Philippe Starck and his famous Louis Ghost armchair in the 21st century.

Condition report: superb work by our upholsterer. Joinery with no gaps, seats and backs refurbished using the traditional method (horsehair on webbing) and covered in a very thick cotton velvet with superb reflections. Matching new trimmings.
