Large standing bull looking into the distance in the tradition of 19th century sculptors for whom plaster is the necessary intermediary between earth and the final material, marble or bronze. Since the earth is difficult to preserve, it is also almost always the first state of the work to be preserved. At a time when technical progress resulted in the rise of foundry-publishers and the production of multiples in large numbers, the plaster model is precious in the eyes of the historian of sculpture because it is the closest to the hand of the artist and often preserves the signs of his work as well as those of the life of the workshop.
