Tapestry requires special care, the ravages of time, humidity, dust, sometimes moth holes, wear by friction, exposure to the sun, are all causes which not only alter the aesthetics of the tapestries, but deteriorate their textile fibers. Woven works require periodic cleaning and partial restorations. Also, a simple wash can restore a spectacular new shine to a dirty tapestry. To accurately assess the state of conservation of a tapestry, it is advisable, before any purchase, to call upon an expert specialized in Tapestry, because although one may be tempted, in the hope of a lower price, When buying at auction, you must be extra careful, because the information that appears in sales catalogs or on the Internet is often approximate and sometimes misleading. The expressions, some wear, small accidents, partly restored can hide a dilapidation which requires costly restoration. Proper cleaning will remove accumulated dust and restore lost shine. Subsequently, the seams of the relays which mark a color change in the weft are often stretched, the threads will have to be tightened to prevent the splits from worsening and in certain cases, the missing parts will have to be rewoven. Finally, to stabilize the state of conservation and give better hold to the tapestry, we will have to line the back of a protective canvas by sewing its Velcro hanging system
