Set of 2 bronze medals engraved by Emile Monier* (1883-1970) and dated 1930, one "Femme Kassonké" and the other "Couple Peulhs", in a glass presentation box (rear), period Third Republic 1930 20th century. These medals are in good general condition. Emile Monier engraved at least six different medals with the people of Africa; Ouolof woman, Peuhls, Kassonké woman, Tuareg Bogoliten, Young Senoufo girl and Moor of Aleg.. Obverse: WOMAN / KASSONKE // KAYES signed: EMILE MONIER. Reverse SUDAN FRANCE, Map of the state of Sudan, women in profile on either side, signed: EM. Obverse: PEULHS. Heads of a Peulh couple in profile on the left, signed: EMILE MONIER 1930. Reverse: GUINEE. Map of Guinea, bananas in the
