Above "THE COMPANION IN MISFORTUNE", below "MEMORIES AND REGRET" with eight baleen whales and iron ribs. Horn hands. Black canvas. Tinplate ground tap. Brass sink. Total height of the umbrella 92.5 cm. France. July Monarchy. Good condition. PROVENANCE: This umbrella would have belonged to Joseph Serrurier, born in Magny in Yonne on July 6, 1788, died on November 11,
