All date from the first half of the 20th century and have been used and worn. No tourist trade, the only pieces that can be found are sold second hand at the Bukhara market. The first: Turkmen tiara from the Yamud tribe. Silver, partially hot-gilded and carnelian. First half of the 20th century. 371Grs Height: 3.5cm Total height: 17cm The second: Pair of engselik temporal buckles. Turkmen Tekke.
