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way. Eduardo Ungar has exhibited his works in several galleries around the world. In 2019, Galerie Bricard in Lourmarin, France, organized an exhibition of his works entitled "Buenos Aires, dream city". This exhibition featured a series of paintings and drawings that capture the beauty and diversity of the city of Buenos Aires, with its culture, monuments, museums and events.
