Description

Earthenware pitcher decorated with disheveled blue and ochre tulips surrounding a round medallion presenting a young viol or luth player in shades of blue. Signature in black ET for Émile Tessier (1887-1971).

The word "Sample" is engraved in the earth on the heel of the pitcher.

This pitcher is a sample, certainly a test to renew the manufacture's models.

Indeed, in 1924, it was Émile Tessier, a former worker for Léon Pouplard earthenware manufacturer from Malicorne, who founded the "Faienceries d'Art" of Malicorne.

He will invent new decorations, drawing inspiration from the decorations of the great earthenware of the 18th century and creating new shapes enabled by openwork techniques.
