Huge and surprising head of a man with a prognathic face sculpted from a single solid cherry log, circa 1930. a surprising and very present work oscillating between art brut and art deco. look closely at the photos, the artist used the heart of the cherry tree and the veins escaping from it give life and contrast to this sculpture. it is reminiscent of certain famous sculptures in museums dedicated to outsider art or art from the first half of the 20th century. blonde patina. Unsigned. no defects to report. be careful, a relatively heavy weight.
