



Saint Anne Trinitarian - 17th Century

Description

Carved softwood group representing the Trinitarian Saint Anne. Worked in high relief, this group was intended to be affixed to the wall of a chapel or an altarpiece.

Coming from Eastern tradition, this iconography developed in Europe from the Crusades and intensified in the Christian West from the middle of the 14th century.

The theme is represented mainly in sculpture and painting and its iconographic characteristics are always intended to signify the physical dependence of Mary and Jesus on Anne. The representations thus adopt, and this is the case of our sculpture, an anti-naturalistic character where Mary is represented barely older than Jesus.
