The Dreyfus affair

It was a state affair that became a major social and political conflict in France during the Third Republic in France, at the end of the 19th century. century. This case concerns the accusation of treason made to Captain Alfred Dreyfus, a Jew of Alsatian origin, who was ultimately exonerated. It shook French society for twelve years, from 1894 to 1906, dividing it deeply and lastingly into two opposing camps: the "Dreyfusards", supporters of Dreyfus's innocence, and the "anti-Dreyfusards", supporters of his guilt.
