Georges Pacouil (1903-1997) The Marne in Dampmart, Seine-et-Marne, 1953 Oil on Canvas 54x65cm Georges PACOUIL (1903-1997) was born in Paris to Catalan parents. A student at the Bernard-Palissy School and above all a student of the pointillist Hippolyte PETITJEAN, his life was punctuated with medals and Honorary Prizes. A neorealist painter, he focuses on form, the structure of nature. His art is similar to that of a Segonzac or a Lapatellière. Theater decorator (1920-1934), painter and teacher since 1934, he exhibited in numerous salons. Member of the Salon d'Automne since 1934, Member of the major Parisian and national Salons. Has participated in major exhibitions abroad: the Balkans, San Francisco, Tunisia, Carnegie Institute of Pittsburgh. Former member of the

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artists' professionalism commission and the Committee of the Society of Independent Artists.
