pair of bronze torches from the Empire period
French work circa 1800 - 1810 attributed to
Claude Galle or follower circular bases decorated
with beaded friezes and gadroons slender baluster
shape of the barrels frieze of palm leaves repeated
on the original bobèche vase very good quality
cast iron of great finesse in the rendering of the
details of the friezes and ornaments Parisian work
from a large bronze workshop at the very
beginning of the 19th century the barrel still cast
in 2 assembled parts removable into 5 parts
attribution to Claude Galle or follower similar
bases noted on known models as well as certain
elements of the decor slender shape of the barrels
also known in the work of this famous bronze
maker and undeniable quality of the bronze
casting in good condition some marks of use in
