- Bronze with medal patina representing two German Shepherd dogs, one sitting the other lying down signed L.Riché with the stamp of the founder Colin in Paris with the mention ANC (former) MON COLIN PARIS in a rounded hollow engraved on the terrace. - Louis Riché born in Paris on 05/29/1877 and died on May 12, 1949 in Paris is a French animal sculptor who was trained by George Gardet (1863-1939), also an animal sculptor in his sculpture workshop. - He exhibited at the Salon of French Artists in Paris for the first time in 1896, when he was 19 years old. - He will continue to exhibit regularly at the Salon of French Artists, particularly between the two wars, of animal subjects, he sculpts numerous animals always treated with naturalism, his talent is recognized and

appreciated in his time and benefits from a notoriety acquired during his lifetime. - He works with many materials, marble, wax, sometimes silver, ivory and mainly bronze. - The Colin company is a prestigious art foundry established at 29 rue Sévigné in Paris in 1848, then at 17 rue des Tournelles from 1914, it has a sales store at 12 avenue Victor Émanuel III in Paris where it sells his bronzes to the public. - The Colin foundry took part in numerous universal exhibitions including Chicago in 1893 and 1900 in Paris where it won a grand prize. - The Colin art foundry worked with many renowned artists in its time including Carrier-Belleuse, Fratin, Mathurin, Moreau, Pradier etc... - The Colin foundry has changed ownership several times and the stamp of the foundry evolves with the succession of the owners of the Colin house and bears the mention from 1843 to 1898 Émile Colin et Cie, from 1898 to 1906 M.Colin et Cie, from 1906 to 1923 Mon Colin, Jollet et Cie since 1923 to 1950 Anc (former) Mon Colin, the foundry closed definitively in 1950. - Period 2nd quarter of the 20th century around 1923-1950.- Reminder to buyers regarding the right of withdrawal for online purchases on my Proantic website.- Must be read before purchasing on my Proantic-hosted sales site.- The right of withdrawal applies to sales made on my Proantic sales site. - The withdrawal period is 14 days following the buyer's receipt of the item or goods. - The buyer must notify me via email or by certified mail, without needing to provide a justification or reason, before the 14 day period provided by law following receipt of the package or item.- The buyer has the right to change their mind and has a 14-business-day cooling-off period as provided by this right of withdrawal law, and I respect this right. - After this period, the sale will be considered final and binding. - The costs of returning the item by mail or through a carrier are the buyer's responsibility in the event of withdrawal by the buyer. - The buyer is

required to return the item within 14 days of receiving the item or package in its original condition as received, without any breakage or damage to the item and in the same packaging in which it was received, with the same shipping costs and with insurance for the item covering the full sale price listed on my Proantic website, as arranged by the seller, and must provide me via email with the proof-of-deposit receipt issued by the post office when the package or item was dropped off at the post office, or the waybill issued by the carrier.- All sales made on my Proantic website are covered by insurance purchased from La Poste at the time the item or package is shipped, covering loss or theft up to the purchase price paid by the buyer. - La Poste does not cover breakage or damage to the item or object; only theft and loss are covered for package shipping.- Additional insurance covering breakage of the item, up to the price paid by the buyer on my Proantic website, is always purchased from the carrier if the item is shipped by them. - The buyer is subject to legal penalties if they do not return the item within this 14-day period and in good condition.- A refund for the item will be issued within 14 days of the seller's receipt of the item or package and after the condition of the item has been verified. - If the item or product is found not to be in its original condition, the sale will be considered final with no refund, and the right of withdrawal cannot be exercised. - The refund for the item or product will be issued via the same payment method (check, bank transfer, PayPal) that the buyer used when making the purchase on my Proantic sales site.- The buyer must take the necessary steps on PayPal themselves to request a refund if they paid via PayPal, specifically by going to the Disputes section and opening a dispute case involving themselves, PayPal, and the seller.- This reminder regarding sales on my Proantic store is intended for litigious individuals and those acting in bad faith. - I advise litigious individuals and those acting in
