Description

Lot of two devotional engravings made by Charles de Mallery (1571-1635). The first represents the scene where Christ crowned with thorns carries the cross through the streets of Jerusalem during the Passion. A phrase in Latin: *iesus baiulans sibi crucem exivit in eum qui dicitur Calvariae locum*, from the Gospel of John. Drawn by Charles de Mallery and published by Jean Messenger around 1600. The second represents the Deposition of Christ. A phrase in Latin: *et accepto corpore, Joseph involuit illud in sindone munda; and posuit illud in monumento suo novo, quod exiderat in Petra*, from the Gospel of Matthew.
