Playing putti are depicted lying on the grass, dreaming or reading, as well as music trophies. In the upper part of the lid there is a woman reclining next to a gilded bronze lamb. Paul Siraudin (1812-1883). This box probably comes from the house set up by Pierre Paul Désiré SIRAUDIN (1812-1883), playwright and librettist, whose other passion was commerce, a passion which he realized by opening a shop at 17
