Description

Baluster-shaped tripod silver coffee pot (950/1000) with escutcheon attachments. The thumb rest lid is moulded and decorated with a frieze of palmettes and fillets on the terrace, topped by a frétel. The lip is adorned with a fine cornice delicately underlined by a frieze of delicately chased pearls. The spout is fluted and has an asparagus point at the base, while a large circular attachment joins the body to the very fine turned wooden handle with gadroons and fillets, complete with its silver screw thread. The three legs are adorned with leafy clasp mouldings.

Condition report: wear from time to carving, an old restoration at the level of the thumb rest attachment at the back (visible in the detailed photographs), an integral part of the life of the object but taken into account in setting the price.

A jug identical to ours, by Louis-Joseph BOUTY, is kept at the Philadelphia Museum of Arts[1].

MILLERAUD-BOUTY

Louis-Joseph BOUTY, known as MILLERAUD-BOUTY, is a Parisian goldsmith born in 1733. He was received as a master in Paris on January 23, 1779, guaranteed by the goldsmith Nicolas CHEVALLIER. On January 30, 1779, he had his hallmark inscribed: a crowned fleur-de-lys, two grains, LJMB, a star. Louis-Joseph BOUTY was first installed on rue Saint-Eloi, then rue de la Juiverie between 1788 and 1791, and finally at 47, quai de l'Horloge. There are traces of his work until 1810, he is mentioned in the Almanach Azur of 1812. Certain models by Louis-Joseph BOUTY are reproduced in Le Cabinet des Modes ou Modes Nouvelles, editions of March 1 and 15, 1786.
