Description

Solid silver spoon with threaded pattern, early 19th century. Hallmarks: The "striche", aka test-tube scratch. It has the appearance of a scar in the metal, a mark that is generally found on works from Wallonia from the 17th and 18th centuries - it was a matter of taking a small sample to verify that the metal was indeed this that he pretended to be. This punch is also called "silver grab". Overprint hallmark - Gothic letter "E": Belgian import hallmark in use from March 1, 1832 to July 1, 1869. In addition, this hallmark was used from March 1, 1832 to May 1, 1832 for the inventory of works dating from before the Dutch period when these did not bear the Dutch guarantee or census hallmarks.
