Cupid, god of love placed in the middle of a rose, emblem of pleasure, is armed with his attributes, his quiver and an arrow which he holds in his hand. He puts his finger in front of his mouth to make you his accomplice while he will soon shoot an arrow that will make his victim fall in love.

Rose is the middle name of Joséphine de Beauharnais, we often find the rose represented at the time of the Empire in reference to the empress.
