Very large size and "light" despite appearances. Most certainly from the production of the Adt family, established in Lorraine since the installation of their factory in Forbach then in Meurthe-et-Moselle, in Pont-à-Mousson and Blénod-Lès-Pont-A-Mousson, in order to continue his commercial dealings in France. Since then, the "Au fil du papier" museum has presented the famous "Queen Victoria's salon", acquired by the City in 1995. Large pieces are also revealed there, the frame of which is often made of wood and the ornaments are made of paper mache. The decorations and ornaments, often inspired by Asian decors, highlight the quite valuable know-how of the ancient Mussipontaine industry.
