This very beautiful bird is made of polychrome porcelain, it bears the marking Bing & Grondahl made fun Denmark 1980. Bing & Grøndahl was a Danish porcelain manufacturer, founded in 1853 by the sculptor Frederik Vilhelm Grøndahl and the brothers Meyer Hermann Bing and Jacob Herman Bing, merchants. The Goéland series of table sets became known as the Danish national table set in the 1950s, with one in ten households owning one. In 1987, Bing & Grøndahl merged with the Royal Porcelain Factory (Den Kongelige Porcelænsfabrik) to become Royal Copenhagen. The bird is in good general condition, neither missing nor cracked.
