Description

The gossip, drypoint and aquatint by Jacques Villon, signed lower right and annotated "ea" for épreuve d'artiste lower left.

Jacques Villon, pseudonym of Gaston Emile
Duchamp, is the brother of Marcel Duchamp and
Raymond Duchamp-Villon. He moved to Paris in
1894 with his brother Raymond to study law. At
the same time, he studied with painter Philippe
Zacharie at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Rouen.
He abandoned his law studies altogether, carried
away by the artistic emulation of Montmartre,
where he met Toulouse-Lautrec and began
designing posters.

He contributed to a number of publications, including Cocorico, L'assiette au Beurre and Gil Blas. This was a period of intense printmaking,

during which he collaborated with Edmond Sagot, a print merchant and pioneer of poster marketing.
