He quickly abandoned this path to devote himself to painting, but retained a geometric rigor inherited from his training. Bitran developed a visual language in which black occupies a central place--a motif deeply linked to his Istanbul origins. He stated: "In truth, the most important color is black. I come from black..."In this "Composition," kraft paper serves as a raw medium, highlighting the contrasts between the luminous areas of blue and ochre and the energetic black lines that structure the

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composition. A constructed organization, playing between abstraction and the suggestion of forms. The superimposition of materials and the energy of the brushstrokes convey a search for dynamism and depth. A subtle balance between perfectly mastered gestural freedom and plastic rigor.
