Tomoko in this case takes the iconography of Judith and interprets it according to her own aesthetic language. Judith, interpreted by Candy Candy is surrounded by products of well-known international brands, such as Nutella, Barilla, Pantene and Hello Kitty.

Tomoko Nagao (1967 Nagao, Japan) is a Japanese artist and one of the leading representatives of the Micropop movement. In her works she introduces stylized forms and a flat, Super Flat style initiated by Murakami.
