Description

Large circular presentation dish in grisaille enameled earthenware representing a lake landscape animated with boats and people. Premières earthenware (côte d'or), Jules Lavalle period (1860-1880).

Signature "Pignant" in the decoration, stencil mark on the back "JL" with caduceus. Some cooking defects in the basin.

Period between 1860 and 1880.

Dimensions: Diam. 45 cm, depth: approximately 5 cm

The Premières earthenware factory (Côte d'Or, France) was founded in 1795 by François Pignant, he was its director until 1823. The superior quality of its earthenware was very noted at the exhibition of the products of French

industry in 1806.

It was in 1857 that Jules Lavalley, grandson of the founder of the earthenware factory, doctor, botanist and politician, became director of the factory. He then undertook to produce artistic earthenware and a large production of common earthenware.

He collaborated with sometimes renowned artists such as Joseph Devers, Marie Pignat, etc.

In 1862, he participated in the Universal Exhibition in London and obtained rave reviews for his production.

As evidenced by the commentary written by Marryat on this occasion: "We cannot pass over in silence the monochromes of Mr. Lavalley, of Premières, gigantic productions which denote in the author a surprising skill of hand and a profound knowledge of technical processes".

Lavalley seems to be the first to have developed a "ceramic pencil" and specific modern processes to create certain decorations close to photography. This large dish is therefore a work of the modern and artistic vision of Jules Lavalley and the artists, thus meeting the technical challenges of its time in the service of an art that spans the centuries.
