Born in Roanne in 1946, Michel Granger has lived in Paris since 1969. His press cartoons were published in 1972, notably in "Pilote". Notoriety came very quickly: from 1975 to 1985, his works illustrated the information of three daily newspapers on the 1st national TV channel, as well as the press magazines Le Nouvel Observateur, Le Progrès, Paris-Match... He is also known worldwide known for having illustrated
