Rare BACHAM Crest mask of the Bamileké of Western Cameroon dimensions Height 46cm x 31cm wide for a depth of 27cm it is semi-hard wood with natural patina, some traces of blackness in places Traces of age wear and small accidents at the crest and at its base indigenous restorations in two places The function of this mask is uncertain but it seems linked to the monarchy of the small Bamileké chiefdoms. For Tamara Northern it would find its use during enthronement ceremonies of the sovereign as well as during his funeral, it would also be used on the occasion of the enthronement of the successor of the deceased king A very high forehead dominates the imposing emergence of the block made up of the cheeks, the nose with wide open nostrils and the oversized mouth revealing
