PINACLE OF A PROCESSION CROSS

Spain, 16th century Gilded copper and iron H. 28 cm, diameter 16 cm (old restorations in pewter)

Gilded copper shaft composed of several arches assembled with iron nails and rivets. It is entirely covered with a rich repoussé decoration of ribboned cartouches, friezes of winged putti heads and serrated cabochons. The upper band features six nuns' faces alternating with radiating flower buds.

Processional staffs, accompanied by processional banners, were carried by religious to mark events Dealer
