The spare point blade bears, on the tang, the hallmark "Nogent inox/ JM/ déposé "that is the one used by Mongin between its installation and 1965

The blade has a mirror polish finish and opens and closes smoothly

Genuine stag horn handle scales over steel liners 100 mm mm long when folded and 180 mm when main blade is out.

The knife is in mint condition. The blade is in full profile and locks up tightly and firmly. Razor sharp. No damage to note to the handles, no dents to the steel parts
