Description

Félix Optat Milet (1838-1911) Magnificent earthenware piece with a shade of blue and gold highlights representing two putti supporting an urn Signed under the base O. Millet, then Thierry and on the base appears the initials GT Height: 29 .5 Note some slight enamel skipping and the missing finger of one of the putti. From 1862 to 1879, he worked at the Manufacture de Sèvres as a modeler, then as a decorator. In 1866, he founded his own ceramic workshop on rue Troyon in Sèvres. I request authorization from the Town Hall of Sèvres to build an oven a stone's throw from the Manufacture. He obtained it, and thus started an independent company which would continue until 1971, managed successively by his son Paul Milet (from 1890 to 1931) and his grandson Henri Milet (from 1931 to 1971).
