Description:Gilded copper, enamels.This plaque represents the Angel Gabriel. He presents a relic. This has disappeared, all that remains is the bat which held the rock crystal cabochon in which the relic was enshrined.A counter plate bore the champlevé, and was decorated with hard stone cabochons.
