Big cult figure called "Yena" collected in the village of Amaki in Papua New Guinea. Nokuma ethnic group. The Yena figures are linked to the cult of the yam. They are placed above a large pile of tubers during the first ceremony (there are 3 in all) organized at harvest time, the aim of which is to thank the ancestors for this sacred gift and to ensure a good harvest the following year. The Yena figures symbolize the period of planting yams in the ground. Wood and traces of pigments. Exceptional piece sold with a base. Approx. 106 x 24 x 18 cm / EUR1600 base included.
