



Surgeon's Set



Description

"CHARRIÈRE | Manufacturer of Surgical Instruments | 9, rue de l'École de Médecine", circa 1850-1860, Green shagreen case decorated with gold threads, interior sheathed in red velvet, silver metal clasp.

Giberne pouch by Charrière. This type of kit was worn on the belt or over the shoulder by army surgeons, and had to bring together in the smallest possible volume a number of necessary instruments which had been defined by the army. Folding case with three folding flaps with 25 instruments (steel, black horn or tortoiseshell handles), most signed Charrière: 2 probes and 1 stylet, 1 pair of curved scissors, 4 scalpels, 1 razor, 2 tweezers, 1 twisting forceps , 1 double erector, and a bellows compartment under the upper flap including 12 bleeding lancets.
