London (Crystal Palace, 1851) and Paris (1855). He created the 1841 Prize Cup for the Goodwood races (Louvre Museum, Paris). It was offered by Ferdinand-Philippe, Duke of ORLÉANS and eldest son of King LOUIS-PHILIPPE, a great horse lover and enlightened patron, to the winner of the Goodwood horse races (United Kingdom) in 1841. This cup, in neo-style -Renaissance, will be ordered by the prince from the sculptor Jean-Baptiste Jules KLAGMANN and created by DURAND. It is currently kept at the Louvre Museum.
