

"Edition printed in 250 copies". (in Brunet). "First edition of the collection of classical French and Latin authors, printed in 250 copies with the title "ad institutionem delphini", while a larger number bears the inscription "clero gallicano dedicata"". (in Graesse). "Vulgate sixto-clementine. Issue intended for the clergy of France from the edition published in the Collection of French and Latin Classical Authors, for the use of the Dauphin. According to the prospectus, published in 1780 and bound at the head of volume I, François-Ambroise Didot should have used for this Bible, which he had been preparing since 1775, the same characters and the same paper as the Monseigneur's 18vo Collection. the Count of Artois". (in Printed Bibles). Printed Bibles, 1140 - Brunet I, Manual for the bookseller and book lover, 881 - Graesse I, Treasures of rare and precious books, 397. Threaded corners. Discreet superficial alterations which may also affect the bindings. Slightly faded backs. Some sheets sometimes very slightly oxidized. Cerne on the margins of the first three volumes; leading to undulation of the sheets. Rare foxing or stains in the body of works.
