The plastic quality of alabaster, a preferred material for the restitution of soft-modelled transparencies, has guaranteed its fame in the art field over the centuries. Rock made up of sediments of evaporated mineral salts, alabaster is made up of a fabric of aggregate mineral concretions, They are dug out in the form of eggs, which are then shaped and carved as desired. In this work the artist has organized a subtle vertical composition, in which he depicts an animal scene with strong veracity. A dove is feeding its chicks, while a snake approaches between the frills, threatening the nest.
