Under the foot we find the shape number 7135 and the Austria mark and another illegible mark. The piece is probably an exhibition or commission piece. Julius Dressler was a noted Bohemianceramics manufacturing company that operated from the late 19th century until the end of World War II.Founded by Julius Dressler in the 1880s in Biela, part of (Tetschen-)Bodenbach in Northern Bohemia, the company produced high-quality decorative faience, maiolica, and porcelain ware.[1] Dressler gained international renown for the ceramics it produced in the early 1900s in the Art Nouveau style, also
