featuring the Taiji (Yin-Yang) symbol. This symbol, fundamental to Taoist philosophy, embodies the dual forces of Yin and Yang and represents the balance of all things in the universe. This interpretation draws from classic Daoist cosmology, in which the interplay of Yin and Yang gives rise to the Five Elements (Earth, Metal, Water, Wood, and Fire), from which the "myriad things" of the world are born. The Five Elders are associated with Taoist teachings and sometimes identified with directional deities corresponding to the five cardinal points in Daoist cosmology. With its superb execution, rare subject matter, and philosophical depth, this piece is a significant and visually compelling work, highly appealing to collectors of Chinese art and Taoist symbolism. Historical Background The Song Dynasty (960-1279 CE) is considered one of the most culturally rich periods in Chinese history, noted for advancements in philosophy, literature, and the arts. Scholars such as Su Dongpo (also known as Su Shi) were central to the intellectual flowering of this era. Scenes such as this one reflect the ideal of scholarly gatherings where philosophical, literary, and cosmological subjects were debated and explored.

This plaque echoes this tradition through both subject and form, incorporating Taoist cosmology and symbolism while also employing sophisticated artistic techniques such as convex modelling for added visual dimension.
