

drawing, Magdeleine Roques perfectly reproduces the atmosphere in which Paul and Virginie spent their childhood. They live in harmony with a nature rich in vegetation, in an almost heavenly setting. This exoticism is reminiscent of tales featuring Adam and Eve. We see that nature has not been perverted by the hands of man, but on the contrary that it has kept its authentic purity, that it has remained virgin.
