Description

This influence is evident in Van Loo's "View of Afsnee," where the interplay of light and colour is central to the composition. Both artists frequently depicted rural and natural scenes, capturing the idyllic beauty of the Belgian countryside. Van Loo's choice of a tranquil, light-filled landscape reflects Claus's thematic focus on the harmonious interaction between nature and light. Claus's technique of using dappled light and broken

brushstrokes to create a luminous effect can be seen in Van Loo's handling of the trees and water. The painting's impressionistic style, with its emphasis on capturing the transient effects of light, aligns with Claus's approach.
