Description

The bargueño, an emblematic piece of furniture from 16th and 17th century Spain, embodies the refinement and craftsmanship of the period. This sumptuous walnut cabinet opens with a flap, revealing a richly decorated interior, composed of thirteen drawers and two doors with iron handles finely decorated with shell motifs. A central leaf completes this complex interior architecture, enhanced by sumptuous decoration. The influence of various styles is evident in the ironwork, bone plaques, and precious marquetry that adorn this piece of furniture. The interior of the cabinet features detailed architectural decoration, with carved bone columns, an imposing pediment, and a finely inlaid Maltese cross. Carved and gilded wooden rods add an additional touch of sophistication. The bargueño

rests on a later base, measuring 149 cm in height, 106 cm in width, and 45 cm in depth. The iron hinges, handles and locks bear witness to the mastery of the craftsmen of the time, adding a robust and timeless charm to the whole.
