This exquisite porcelain figurine depicts a young woman carrying water. The quality of the workmanship is evident in the detailed depiction of the face, the jewels and the intricate designs on the pedestal. Each element of this figurine has been meticulously crafted with remarkable precision. Please note the motif number on the bottom of the figurine: 77. The early Royal Dux pieces are known for their meticulous craftsmanship and attention to detail. Royal Dux porcelain has been produced in Duchkov, Czech Republic, since 1853. The company was founded by Eduard Eichler, who was inspired by the famous porcelain factories of Meissen and Dresden. The company name, "Dux," comes from the Latin word for "duke," a title held by Eichler's father-in-law. Initially, the company produced

simple white tableware, but it soon began experimenting with colors and decorative techniques. In the 1870s Royal Dux moved into the production of figurines, which became the mainstay of the company in the early 20th century. Today Royal Dux figurines are highly sought after by collectors and the company continues to produce porcelain tableware and figurines. This figurine is in excellent condition and has a beautiful balance of colour to the dress, with soft undertones characteristic of the Bohemian porcelain school. The base bears a distinctive pink clay stamp with the letter 'E', indicating that it was made in the late 19th century.
