

Very Large "blanc De Chine" Buddhist Lion - China 17th Century Circa 1640



Description

A large porcelain Buddhistic Lion of extremely high quality. It is rare to see such a detailed figure with such a cream glaze. They were commonly seen towards the end of the 17th century, then under Kangxi and throughout the Qing Dynasty. This Fo dog is unusual in that its height of just over 34cm makes it a particularly large example. The elements of its collar are also extremely accomplished. All the elements in relief show the enormous care taken in making this lion. Although this Fo lion was originally an incense-holder, the element allowing an incense stick to be inserted has been broken off. China 17th century Late Ming Dynasty, Circa 1640
