He is known for his nudes and landscapes, especially between the two wars. He also produced some rare bronzes and bas-reliefs. Fernand Majorel was a versatile artist, recognized for his work as a painter and sculptor. He also worked as a cabinetmaker and furniture designer. He explored different artistic styles, ranging from cubism to fauvism, including abstract art. The artist mainly worked on nudes and landscapes, especially from the interwar period.
