Silver Seal, An Emissary Of Charles V, 16th Century, Beautiful Coat Of Arms



Description

Round silver seal die, unmounted plate, diameter 3.3cm, superbly engraved, legible, with a complex coat of arms: under helmet with the crest of a winged dragon holding a mace, a coat of arms in 3 quarters: a raised serpent, a dragon with a mace, and an arrow between two flowers. This coat of arms belonged to an emissary, (the translation is: informant, or perhaps prefect of a region), under Charles V for Eberstadt in Westphalia, as indicated around Roman capital letters. (or other place, the names change in 5 centuries), Nice engraving work, I left the wax fillings, picturesque on photo; No visible flaw. Weight, 11gr, no hallmark.
